

Foxes, Coyotes, and Wolves

Foxes, coyotes, and wolves look like dogs. In fact, they are relatives of domestic dogs.

They have very good hearing and can turn their ears from side to side to find where a sound is coming from.

They have four toes on each foot and walk on their toes!

Foxes, coyotes, and wolves are carnivores. They eat meat. Coyotes and foxes will also eat insects, berries, and grasses.

Large canine teeth help them grab and hold their prey.
