Introduction

EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION

It is important to periodically evaluate our ability to communicate our position on issues with the state legislature. The legislative voting record on these issues is one way to measure our effectiveness in communicating our position. A brief summary of the bills from the 48th Second regular session (2007) for issues on which the Game and Fish Commission has taken a formal position is included in this summary.

SUMMARY OF THE 48TH LEGISLATURE 1ST REGULAR SESSION

The Arizona State Legislature adjourned *sine die* on Wednesday June 20th, 2007 at 10:58pm. The Legislative Session was lengthy (164 days) tying for fifth on the list of the longest regular sessions. A budget was struck in the waning days of session between the Governor, the House and Senate after lengthy negotiations.

The majority of the Arizona Game and Fish Commission (Commission) and Arizona Game and Fish Department's (Department) time was devoted to authorization of the Commission's budget and passage of HB 2443 *off-highway vehicles; user fee*.

The Commission voted to oppose only one bill, SB 1492 *lottery proceeds; university scholarships*, which was never given a committee hearing. The bill directed funds upstream of the Heritage Fund for other purposes, which may have jeopardized full funding of the Heritage Fund.

Governor's nominees to the Game and Fish Commission



Commissioner Martin was appointed by the Governor to the Game and Fish Commission on June 22, 2006 after the Senate failed to move her nomination to the full Senate floor for a vote. Commissioner Martin was approved by the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Rural Affairs on March 28th, 2007 and received unanimous Senate approval on May 15th, 2007

Commissioner Robert R. Woodhouse was nominated by the Governor and received approval from the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Rural Affairs on April 25th, 2007 and was confirmed by the full Senate unanimously on May 15th, 2007.



General Effective Date

The general effective date for 2006 enactments not containing an emergency clause, or other specified date is the 90th day after the Legislature adjourns *sine die*. For this past regular legislative session, the general effective date is **Wednesday September 19, 2007**.

BILL SUMMARIES & DISPOSITION¹

BILL SUMMARIES

➤ **HB 2093 *Barry Goldwater range; concurrent jurisdiction***

Sponsor: Representative John Nelson

Summary: The list of lands for which the federal government may request concurrent criminal jurisdiction with the state is expanded by adding the Barry M. Goldwater Range. (Allows federal officers to enforce title 17 violations.)

Disposition: 3/26/07 Held in Senate Judiciary. (See SB 1326)

Impact Level: NORMAL (Yes Vote +1, No Vote -1)

➤ **HB 2116 *big game permits; grandchildren***

Sponsor: Representative Jerry Weiers

Summary: The list of persons who may transfer a big game permit is expanded to include grandparents who may transfer a permit to a minor grandchild. The minor must be accompanied in the field by the transferring grandparent or the minor's parent or guardian.

Disposition: 4/6/07 Signed by Governor Chap. 5 Laws 2007

Impact Level: MEDIUM (Yes Vote +2, No Vote -2)

➤ **HB 2117 *big game permits; transfers***

Sponsor: Representative Jerry Weiers

Summary: The list of people to whom a holder of a big game permit may transfer the permit is expanded to include a minor child with a permanent physical "disability." If the child is younger than 14, the child must complete the hunter education course offered by the Game and Fish Department. A definition of "disability" is added stating, it refers to a permanent physical impairment that

"substantially" limits one or more of the child's "major life activities," requiring assistance by a person or mechanical device for mobility.

Disposition: 4/16 signed by Governor. Chap. 66, Laws 2007

Impact Level: MEDIUM (Yes Vote +2, No Vote -2)

➤ **HB 2443 *off-highway vehicles; user fee***

Sponsor: Representative Jerry Weiers

Summary: Effective January 1, 2008, various changes in statutes related to operation of off-highway vehicles, including a requirement that off-highway vehicles display a sticker (or indicia) issued by the Department of Transportation and that a fee is charged for the indicia. Proceeds from the sale of indicia would be distributed to various state and local agencies for law enforcement, mitigation, trails, education and information. Off-highway vehicles must have certain equipment and minors operating an off-highway vehicle must wear helmets. Violations are considered civil traffic violations. New license plates are established for off-highway vehicles, which must systematically replace the current plates, and which are valid for one year. Off-highway vehicles are subject to a vehicle license tax of \$3 instead of the regular VLT rate. It is a class 3 misdemeanor to drive an off-highway vehicle off of an existing road or trail in a way that causes damage to wildlife habitat, cultural or natural resources, or property; to drive an off-highway vehicle on closed roads or trails; to operate an off-highway vehicle in connection with acts of vandalism or other crimes; or for anyone other than a government agent to place or remove a regulatory sign governing off-highway vehicle use on any public or state land.

Disposition: 6/20/07 failed on reconsideration 15-10 (Senate)

Impact Level: HIGH (Yes Vote +3, No Vote -3)

➤ **HCM 2008 *urge protection; Kofa herd***

Sponsor: Representative Jerry Weiers

Summary: Urges Congress to designate the Arizona Game & Fish Commission as lead agency in the management of non-endangered state wildlife and further urges the Commission to employ all tools and resources to recover the Kofa National Wildlife Refuge's bighorn sheep population, which has declined from 812 in 2000 to 390 in 2006.

Disposition: 4/12 passed Senate 19-9; to Secretary of State

Impact Level: NORMAL (Yes Vote +1, No Vote -1)

➤ **SB 1305 disabled veterans' complimentary licenses**

Sponsor: Senator Rebecca Rios

Summary: Would have allowed the Game and Fish Commission to issue complimentary fishing licenses to veterans who are receiving compensation for permanent service connected disabilities rated at least 70% disabling.

Disposition: 2/1/07 from Senate nat res-rural with amend, no COW hearing

Impact Level: MEDIUM (Yes Vote +2, No Vote -2)

➤ **SB 1326 concurrent jurisdiction; Barry Goldwater Range**

Sponsor: Senator Barbara Leff

Summary: The list of lands on which both the state and the federal government have concurrent criminal jurisdiction is expanded to include the Goldwater Range.

Disposition: 5/8/07 signed by governor. Chap. 197, Laws 2007

Impact Level: NORMAL (Yes Vote +1, No Vote -1)

➤ **SB 1355 Goldwater range; concurrent jurisdiction**

Sponsor: Senator Amanda Aguirre

Summary: The list of lands for which the federal government may request concurrent criminal jurisdiction with the state is expanded by adding the Barry M. Goldwater Range.

Disposition: 2/1/07 referred to Senate judiciary, no hearing **(See SB 1326)**

Impact Level: NORMAL (Yes Vote +1, No Vote -1)

BUDGET BILLS

➤ **HB 2781 general appropriations; 2007-2008; 2008-2009**

Sponsor: Representative John McComish

Summary: Makes general appropriations for state agencies and session law changes related to the FY2007-08 budget. **94% of Commission budget approved including:** on-line application fee waived for watercraft users, new radio towers and radio tower upgrades, life jacket loaner program and boating safety grant program. Several habitat restoration projects, Sportsmen's club grant, shooting range and hatchery renovations and a 3.25% pay increase to all employees (the.25% is performance pay).

Disposition: 6/25/07 Signed by Governor Laws 2007 Chap. 255

Impact Level: HIGH(Yes Vote +3, No Vote -3)

➤ **HB 2783 appropriations; capital outlay**

Sponsor: Representative John McComish

Summary: Approves all Game and Fish capital projects.

Analysis

HOW LEGISLATORS VOTED

Below you will find the non weighted and weighted results of how members of the legislature voted on Commission supported/ opposed bills.

KEY TO THE TABLES ON THE FOLLOWING PAGES

Impact Non Weighted Votes

Occasionally legislators are not available for a vote on the floor and subsequently their position is not recorded. A non weighted scale takes in the amount of times a legislator simply voted with the Commission position on legislation.

The last recorded vote on a piece of legislation is depicted only.

The scale is as follows:

- Voted for the Commission position = 1
- Voted against the Commission position = 0

The number of times the legislator voted with an AGFD Commission position is divided by the total number of bills (the Commission has taken a position on) the legislator voted on.

Example: Representative L supported the Commission position 5 times out of a possible 10 Commission position bills. Rep. L supports the Commission position 50% of the time.

Impact Weighted

Because not all bills impact the Department to an equal degree, the bills are assigned a level of impact in order to place a greater emphasis on more important bills in which the Department sought more support or emphatically opposed. The votes on all bills are weighted in accordance with the degree of impact on the Department. In general, the level of impact of a bill is measured by considering the bill's affect on the existing authority of the Commission, the Department's financial security, or the Department's overall ability to effectively manage wildlife.

The last recorded vote on a piece of legislation is depicted only.

THE WEIGHTING SCALE IS AS FOLLOWS:

- Bill of NORMAL Impact:
Vote in favor of the Commission position +1
Against the Commission position -1
- Bill of MEDIUM Impact:
Vote in favor of the Commission position +2
Against the Commission position -2
- Bill of HIGH Impact:
Vote in favor of the Commission position +3
Against the Commission position -3

Bill Sponsorship (1st Primary Sponsor)

- A sponsor of a bill supported by the Commission will receive 1 additional point per bill sponsorship
- A sponsor of a bill opposed by the Commission will lose 1 point per bill sponsorship

Total Points = Total number of weighted points versus the total number of weighted points possible (excluding points possible from bill sponsorship) if the legislator were to consistently vote in favor of the AZGFD position.

Note

This scorecard is not intended to be used in judging legislators, but rather, our ability to effectively communicate our position on issues. Also, these calculations do not take into account work that goes on behind the scene on legislative issues (i.e., helping a bill be heard and debated).








HOUSE, NON WEIGHTED TABLE ²







SENATE, NON WEIGHTED TABLE. 4





SENATE, NON WEIGHTED TABLE. ⁵




